Only original work will be accepted. Plagiarism is not only illegal, but harms the original work and efforts of authors. Written assignments during your coursework at ASU will be accepted provided they meet the Article Guidelines listed below. Authors may submit more than one paper and may publish jointly with other students. Papers should include an Abstract and should be relevant to the theme announced. Papers will not necessarily be returned for editing; however, some papers may be accepted with conditional limitations and feedback may be provided by the Editorial Board.

Submission Deadlines:

August 15, 2014, for a September 30, 2014, publication

The student editorial board will use their discretion to accept, reject, or postpone manuscripts.

Article Guidelines:

Articles may vary in writing style (i.e., tone and perspective) and length. Articles should be relevant to the field of Border and Homeland Security, Intelligence Studies, Criminal Justice, Culture Studies and Cultural Competency, or Security Studies, or a related discipline of significant interest to our readership. The targeted

audience for this publication includes practitioners, policymakers, theorists, researchers, students, faculty, and others interested in learning more about Homeland and National Security within the disciplines named above.

Please include your name, affiliation, and e-mail address, which will be used as your biographical Information. Submission of an article to *Perspectives in Homeland Security* implies that the article has not been published elsewhere nor is it currently under submission to another publication.

Minimum length: 2,000 words (eight pages)

Maximum length: 3,750 words (15 pages)

Exceptions: The Editorial Board may make exceptions based upon literary content, relevancy of the material, of potential contribution to theory, practice, research, or policy

Photos: jpeg or gif

Text format: Microsoft Word, RTF, TXT, or ASCII

Citation Style:

APA or CMS, with footnotes, graphs, charts, tables, images, figures, etc. in appropriate format and properly attributed to original sources.

Papers not properly cited using either APA or CMS will not be accepted for consideration.

Formatting your article:

Please refer to the submission guidelines specific to this journal. When formatting your references, please ensure you check the reference style followed by your chosen journal.

Please see [SAGE Harvard](#) reference style, the [SAGE Vancouver](#) reference style and the [APA](#) reference style. The ASU CSS eJournal manuscript guidelines are similar and adopted from the Sage Publication style, and include the following:

Artwork guidelines:

Illustrations, pictures and graphs, should be supplied with the highest quality and in an electronic format that helps us to publish your article in the best way possible. Please follow the guidelines below to enable us to prepare your artwork for the printed issue as well as the online version.

Author: Only ASU CSS enrolled students in good standing may submit articles for publication. All work must be original work and must be submitted electronically via the established system. Abstracts may be as long as 150 words. All Abstracts will be published, and authors will be listed. All submissions will be retained by the Editorial Board, and all work will be copyrighted.

Format: TIFF, JPEG, PDF: Common format for pictures (containing no text or graphs).
EPS: Preferred format for graphs and line art (retains quality when enlarging/zooming in). MS

Office files (Word, PowerPoint, Excel) are also accepted.

Placement: Figures/charts and tables created in MS Word should be included in the main text rather than at the end of the document.

Figures and other files created outside Word (i.e. Excel, PowerPoint, JPG, TIFF, EPS, and PDF) should be submitted separately. Please add a placeholder note in the running text (i.e. "[insert Figure 1.]")

Resolution: Bitmap based files (i.e. with .tiff or .jpeg extension) require a resolution of at least **300 dpi** (dots per inch). Line art should be supplied with a resolution of 600 dpi.

Format: TIFF, EPS or PDF. MS Office files (Word, Powerpoint, Excel) are also accepted provided they meet certain conditions.

Color: Please note that images supplied in color will be published in color online and black and white in print (unless otherwise arranged). Therefore, it is important that you supply images that are comprehensible in black and white as well (i.e. by using color with a distinctive pattern or dotted lines). The captions should reflect this by **not** using words indicating color.

Dimension: Check that the artworks supplied match or exceed the dimensions of the journal. Images **cannot** be scaled up after origination.

Fonts: The lettering used in the artwork should not vary too much in size and type (usually sans serif font as a default).
